Meet Maiko Ando, our visitor from Japan

Three weeks ago, Maiko Ando's world made a huge change. Within 24 hours, she left the comfort of her home

in the rural, Japanese town of Uga – near Nagoya in central Japan – where her friends lived – to take up residence at our home in the Upper Valley.

She didn't just change geography. Maiko entered a world with whole new routines and customs – but one that is presenting her with new friends, a new language and new ways of living. And if learning English, going to a new school and getting used to the desert climate weren't enough, she is getting a healthy dose of Spanish and Mexican culture thrown in for fun.

Maiko, 17, is the foreign exchange student sponsored by the Rotary Club of West El Paso. She is getting her first real experience abroad. She has made one trip to Hong Kong, she says, but otherwise she has stayed home all of her life.

Back home, Maiko's father owns and runs a Toyota-Honda car dealership, where her mother also works. In Japan, Maiko attended the Maryknoll School, where she took all of her classes in Japanese but one English class, which she studied last year.

She has two sisters: Akiko, who is 19, and Maniko, 22.

In Japan, Maiko's favorite hobbies are shopping and dancing. And she's a self-described "late riser" who doesn't like rain (it rains a lot in her home state, or "prefecture," of Mie).

The first three weeks in El Paso have a challenge for Maiko, one that she has embraced and generally enjoyed.

Things haven't always gone smoothly – on her second day in the United States, when we took her to register for classes, the school nurse wouldn't allow her to register until she got her immunization shots up to date. So we took her to a clinic, which ended up giving her five shots (including a hepatitis shot – ouch!), which Maiko probably didn't expect but didn't complain about.

But all in all, Maiko says she is enjoying her time in El Paso, seeing new sites, making new friends and overall getting used to a new world.
